You've probably heard the buzz about the upcoming changes scheduled for Wildwood's downtown district, but probably aren't aware of what will be happening or when. Now's your chance to get the scoop from Wildwood's City Manager, Jason McHugh. Mr. McHugh will be the guest speaker at our May General Membership meeting .

Once heavily reliant on rail and transportation, the City's economy is now centered on retail. Therefore, the City wants to spur investment and redevelopment within its downtown district. A Downtown Master Plan to facilitate redevelopment was adopted by the City Commission in November 2021 after multiple public participation events that engaged residents and business owners in the planning process. Projects are now underway with more scheduled to start in the near future.

Jason McHugh, City Manager, will give an overview of the community-driven vision for the future development of Wildwood.

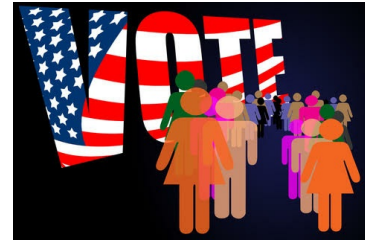

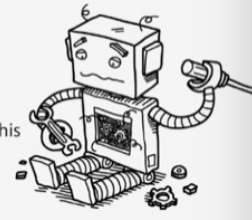
