This will be an **important meeting** to decide possible critical additions to our Program: what, if any, education issues should be included in our focus.


After a quick review of our *Case for Focus*, members will participate in small group discussions about which components of education truly fit into our nonpartisan 2023-2024 Program. A general discussion

Co-Presidents Column **Spreading the Need for Focus throughout** **Florida**

At the LWWFL Convention in June, LWVTRI Board members had the opportunity to discuss the need for focus with other Leagues. Many expressed interest and our conversations with those Leagues are ongoing. The LWWFL Board is still committed to a broad range of issues but realizes this is causing many people to view the League as partisan. Debbie Chandler, LWWFL's Co-President, wrote in the August issue of The Florida Voter about her decision-making process for selecting issues to be included in Legislative Priorities:

I considered whether other organizations were a better voice for the issue. Some organizations are experts in the field, just as we are experts in the voting arena. Are we better served lending our support to them, rather than trying to carry the issue ourselves?

Florida LWV Litigation Activity


After the last legislative session a number of new laws were passed that disenfranchise voters. Your Florida League is fighting back with six lawsuits. To learn more, check out [our website](#).
